Enrollment Update

Web registration for summer and fall 2019 is underway. Based on the June 5th data prepared by the KCCD Institutional Research Office, BC's headcount has increased by 1,280 (10.8%), enrollments increased by 2,190 (13.0%) and FTES increased by 196.2 (11.0%).

Renegade Athletics Finishes #19 in CCCAA NATYCAA Cup Standings for 2018-19

Renegade Athletics has finished the 2018-2019 academic year with a #19 finish in the California Community College Athletic Association (CCCAA) and National Association of Two Year College Athletic Administrators (NATYCAA) Cup Standings. Out of all SoCal schools, the Renegades finished 12th. The ranking moves Bakersfield College up 11 spots from 2017-18 being tied for #30, and the year before that (2016-17) of being tied for #50.

NATYCAA is the professional organization of two-year college athletic administrators and membership is open to all two-year institutions throughout the country. The NATYCAA Awards were designed to recognize and reward overall program excellence at the two-year college level.



BC's Career Education Goes Online

In partnership with the California State Online Education Initiative and the California Virtual Campus, Bakersfield College has received a \$500,000 grant to bring multiple Career and Technical Education programs fully online in the next year. This opportunity will build upon the several innovations connecting BC's online education programs with highly available workforce training. Each program will leverage Open Educational Resources to drastically reduce the cost of textbooks and course materials, increasing the availability of these programs for all students, regardless of their level of income. Finally, these innovative programs will leverage cutting edge innovations that allow students to easily navigate the certificate programs and even get credit for prior learning. The CTE Goes Online program will utilize several key innovations already at work in other areas of Bakersfield College:



1. The *Guided Pathways Initiative* has created streamlined academic and career pathways that help students complete their education in less time, with fewer wasted units.
2. The *Pathways Program Mapper* is an innovative software tool that assists students in the development of their educational plan, by visualizing the courses they need to take each semester in order to reach their goal.
3. *Open Educational Resources* are textbooks, developed by experts in the field, that are available to students at low or no cost. They are used in various classes throughout the college to lower the overall cost of education, making success more attainable for all students.
4. The *Early College Program* allows students to complete college credit while still in high school. The addition of these innovative programs will increase the options available to all students, including those in the Early College Program.

BC's Dual Enrollment Receives Beautiful Bakersfield Award 2019

Bakersfield College Dual Enrollment was recognized as the recipient of the 2019 Beautiful Bakersfield award in the Education category recognizing efforts that promote or benefit education at all levels. Hosted by the Greater Bakersfield Chamber of Commerce, the annual awards gala was attended by more than 700 people at the Rabobank Theater and Convention Center. The Dual Enrollment program was selected from among nine finalists. The Bakersfield College Performing Arts Department was also one of ten finalists in the Arts and Culture category. Special thanks to the Greater Bakersfield Chamber of Commerce and to BC's Dual Enrollment team for all their work.
