BC Hosts First Vaccination Clinics

After weeks of preparation and waiting to receive allocations from the state, we were able to host our first vaccine clinic on March 9 at Levinson Hall, serving 94 eligible Kern County residents with the Moderna vaccine. On March 11, we were able to vaccinate 105 individuals with the Johnson and Johnson vaccine at BC SouthWest and Levinson Hall.

With the support of our partners at Dignity Health, we hosted on first drive-through clinic at the Memorial Stadium parking lot on March 12, providing 118 doses of the Moderna vaccine.



On Sunday, March 14, we had our first rural vaccination clinic in Arvin, and today at the Delano Campus.

Now that the state has reached the benchmark of vaccinating 2 million people in underserved communities, the California Department of Public Health has raised the threshold for entering the "red" tier of California's Blueprint for a Safer Economy from 7 cases per 100,000 to 10 cases per 100,000, <u>according to the San Jose Mercury-News</u>. With the new threshold, 13 counties have moved from the purple or "widespread" tier to the red or "substantial" tier along with 65 percent of California's population.

In Kern County, the state is reporting our rates at 11.1 per 100,000 residents, which is just short of the criteria to advance into the red tier, <u>according to the Bakersfield</u> <u>Californian</u>.

Dr. Fauci Says Restrictions Will Ease by Fourth of July if US Cases Continue to Drop



Dr. Anthony Fauci <u>spoke with Jake Tapper on CNN's "State of the Union" show</u> on Sunday morning and stated that federal guidelines "will be much more liberal" by Independence Day as cases decrease and more Americans become vaccinated. However, Fauci cautioned that new variants could potentially trigger another surge like in Italy, <u>where</u> <u>the country has announced an Easter lockdown</u>.

Data Corner

Vaccine Tracker

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has <u>a vaccination dashboard</u> that tracks the number of COVID-19 vaccines administered and delivered across the United States. The California Department of Public Health has <u>a dashboard tracking vaccinations in the</u> <u>state overall</u> and by county. However, neither the CDC or CDPH dashboards provide information about the number of vaccine doses delivered by county.
