The KCCD IR enrollment report we are down in student enrollments for both summer and fall. We are not surprised with the dip in enrollment given the very unusual semester of *sheltering in place* and the uncertainties of the next few months related to the COVID-19 situation.

While many students are hesitant to register for courses in the face of so much uncertainty, let's remind them of their resilience. Let's not allow the unknown to derail our students from reaching their goals. Now that we are wrapping up the spring semester, make some time today to send a nudge and give them the confidence they need to enroll in summer and fall 2020 classes.

Here are some ideas:

4-week classes Start May 18th: Starting May 18th, BC is offering 4-week summer classes that enable students to complete one of their Golden Four requirements for CSU Transfer.

These open classes are:

- Communication B1: Public Speaking (9 sections with openings)
- Communication B4: Persuasive Communication (1 section with openings)
- Communication B5: Argumentation and Debate (2 sections with openings)

• Communication B8: Small Group Communication (3 sections with openings)

COMM B1, B4, and B8 all fulfill the oral communication requirement, and COMM B5 fulfills the CSU critical thinking requirement.

Why should students enroll in 4 week classes? BC research shows that students succeed in compressed courses. While a four-week public speaking class can be frightening to some students, past students often comment that the intensive nature of the class helped them to overcome their public speaking anxiety better than a typically scheduled 16-week semester class. Taking just 1 or two courses over the summer can help a student complete their degree faster by ensuring that they hit that 30-unit momentum point.

Early College Summer 2020: If you have high school students (9th grade-12th grade), help us get the word out that high schoolers can enroll right now in college-level courses to accelerate their higher education path. Courses include ENGL B1A, MATH B22, MATH B1A, HIST B17A&B, and so many more.
