Enrollment Update





A data snippet

BC's student enrollment has been growing the past five years and we have been able to grow our faculty count. Here is a screen capture from the data prelude section of our ISER.

As BC's annual Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) has increased over the past five years, so, too, has the annual Full-Time Equivalent Faculty (FTEF), thanks to large increases in the hiring of contract faculty in the past five years.





While the numbers of contract faculty and adjunct faculty have been relatively close for some time, in fall 2017 the number of contract faculty surpassed the number of adjunct faculty.

A Better BC Update:

Parking:

The following parking lots are closed for the final phase of parking lot renovations:

- P8 (Student parking lot on University Avenue next to football fields)
- Road with entrance from University (closed until the Field House)
- P11 (Staff parking lot near LA building and pool)

The P9 parking lot (staff parking lot near tennis courts) will be closed for one week, from October 8-October 15. The final phase of parking lot renovations will be completed by October 15.

Our M&O crew has set up mirrors to assist in entering and exiting the temporary lot, as well as stop signs. The gravel in this lot is a bit larger than expected because that area is the future construction road for AECOM and Measure J projects. We have temporarily converted it to a parking lot in our continued efforts to alleviate congestion. This area will be back into the construction zone as soon as the parking lots are completed.
