COVID updates

Vaccinations are on my mind Here is <u>a 50-second video to encourage our communities to get vaccinated</u>. I invite you to do the same and create a short 30-second video that you can post in Canvas or social media or send to coworkers, family and friends to invite them to get vaccinated as well.

More than 99 percent of recent COVID deaths are from unvaccinated people

As new cases and hospitalizations continue to rise due to the delta variant, a report from NPR indicates an overwhelming majority of people facing the most adverse reactions from COVID are unvaccinated. The article quotes Dr. Anthony Fauci and CDC Director Dr. Rochelle Walensky, who note that 99 percent of COVID deaths since May were individuals that weren't vaccinated, and also that unvaccinated people accounted for 97 percent of the COVID hospitalizations.

Similar statistics apply locally. <u>The Bakersfield Californian reports</u> that since mid-January, 99.4 percent of COVID cases in Kern County have occurred in people who have not been vaccinated.

Vaccinations at Colleges and Universities:

The American Association of Medical Colleges <u>is urging medical schools and teaching hospitals</u> to mandate COVID-19 vaccination for their employees.

Local Governments Across State Encouraging Everyone to Continue Wearing Masks, Even if Vaccinated

The Los Angeles County of Public Health <u>reinstated mandatory masking</u> indoors effective July 17. All individuals in LA County are required to wear masks indoors regardless of vaccination status.

Other areas of the state are without an official order are encouraging continued masking. In Fresno County, the Department of Public Health is "strongly recommending" that all individuals wear masks indoors whether vaccinated or not. Every county in the Bay Area and the city of Berkeley have issued similar recommendations, according to ABC 7 News.

California Community Colleges Chancellor Eloy Oakley to join Biden administration

California Community Colleges Chancellor Eloy Oakley is joining the Biden administration in a temporary role to provide advice on higher education.

Deputy Chancellor Dr. Daisy Gonzales will serve as acting chancellor when Oakley begins his new position on July 26, until his return sometime in late fall.

Oakley has overseen the California Community Colleges system since 2016.
