COVID-19 Updates

Kern County ICUs reach highest level in 8 months

As of September 22, there were 80 Kern County residents in the ICU with COVID-19, which is the highest number of patients in ICUs since January 30, <u>according to KGET</u>. State projections are that this week would be the peak of hospitalizations, two weeks after local cases peak. <u>Kern County Public Health confirmed 391 new cases and 4 deaths</u> on Wednesday, September 22.

FDA authorizes booster shots for seniors over 65 and for those at high risk.

<u>The Food and Drug Administration has cleared the way</u> for a third dose of the Pfizer vaccine to be issued to individuals who are 65 years of age or older or who may have a condition or occupation that puts them at increased risk for COVID-19. <u>The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention are meeting on Thursday, September 23</u> to issue final approval on administering booster shots.

Pandemic creating shortage of teachers and school staff

Across the country, school districts across the K-14 system are experiencing staffing shortages as COVID-19 has created unprecedented burnout on our educators and their support teams. The Associated Press reported a study from the National Education Association that said 32 percent of teachers were driven to leave the profession earlier than expected as a result of the pandemic. Teachers are twice as likely as other employed adults to feel frequent job-related stress and three times more likely to experience depression, according to another survey cited in the article.

Percentage of enrollments f2f vs distance ed

I thought you might appreciate seeing this data snippet from Bob Ngo that I picked up at one of the meetings. For the Fall semester district-wide, about 67 percent of all enrollments are in distance education courses. Cerro Coso has the highest percentage of distance education enrollments, at 85.4 percent. Porterville College has the lowest percentage of distance education enrollments, at 52.5 percent. Bakersfield College's percentage of distance education enrollments is slightly lower than the district-wide data, at 65.8 percent.
