

Chancellor's Update

August 1, 2023

Colleagues,

I hope you are all staying well hydrated while we brave the hot Bakersfield summer. I'm looking forward to the new academic year and excited for the opportunity to continue to serve our existing and incoming students. I sincerely hope you had time to refresh, spend time with your family, get much needed rest, or take a trip. As we wind down the summer, I wanted to give you a few updates on budget and some of the events I've attended.

Visit to NREL

Earlier this month, the National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) hosted our California

Renewable Energy (CREL) team, along with staff from the Kern Community College District (KCCD), Bakersfield College (BC) and the Foundation for the California Community Colleges. During the visit, subject matter experts, technical partners, and leadership had an opportunity to collaborate on technical projects, including agrivoltaics, microgrids and battery storage, and participated in discussions on community connections, workforce development, and education and training in clean energy. Special thanks to our NREL partners for



providing an informative tour of their research support facility at the South Table Mountain campus, and for our visit to Jack's Solar Garden, the largest commercial agrivoltaics research site in the U.S., located in Boulder Colorado. We are excited to see these collaborations unfold as CREL continues to grow in their role in climate change on behalf of KCCD and our community.

Budget Update

The Governor has signed the State's budget and the good news is that community colleges are still coming out ahead. The budget uses a significant increase in the cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) of 8.22 percent on the Student Centered Funding Formula, and is driving an increase in the revenues of the district. However, the District is concerned about the current projected state budget deficit of \$31.5 billion and that the 8.22% COLA is partially supported with one-time funds. This COLA has been assigned to a number of categorical programs, but unfortunately not all programs are seeing



an increase. The District has therefore opted to use a lower COLA in its projections of revenues associated with the SCFF. The COLA to be used in our adopted budget is inline with the LAO's suggested COLA of 5% to account for these one-time funds and is supported by our Board of Trustees. Unfortunately, the budget does claw back over 59% of the 2022-23 allocation for scheduled maintenance. In addition, many of the one-time items we've seen over the past several years have gone away as the State's revenue has not kept up with expectations. The Governor's roadmap for success has put a focus

on improved student educational outcomes, seeking to advance equity, expecting increased intersegmental collaboration, and seeking improved workforce preparedness. The 2023-24 budget for community colleges and KCCD should be considered a "win", and the finances of the District remain strong.

Vice President Retreat

Special thanks to Interim Vice Chancellor of Educational Services Gregory Anderson for holding the inaugural VP Council Summer Retreat in beautiful Kernville. Springlike weather welcomed the VPs of instruction and student services to strengthen district-wide collaboration, analyze data, advance institutional effectiveness, and recommit themselves *to delivering on the promise of student success with equity*.
