## Martin Luther King Jr. Community Awards Breakfast

I had the wonderful privilege of attending the annual Martin Luther King Jr. Community Awards Breakfast with our acting Bakersfield College President Steven Watkin, Trustees Yovani Jimenez, Romeo Agbalog and Nan Gomez-Heitzeberg, and our State Chancellor Sonya Christian. The event hosted close to 500 people including local dignitaries and was held at the Martin Luther King Center in east Bakersfield. We heard from a variety of speakers as different awards were presented. Our own Steve Watkin was recognized for his local leadership and being the first Black president of



Bakersfield College. The event served as a great reminder of the work Dr. King did and his continued inspiration of those carrying on that work in our local communities today.

## CRC Carbon TerraVault Clean Energy Park Tour at Elk Hills



On December 12th we toured the California Resource Corporation (CRC) Carbon TerraVault (CTV) Clean Energy Park in Elk Hills. California is leading the way in pursuing innovative technology solutions to achieve its emissions reduction goals and combat climate change. At CRC and CTV, they are committed to the energy transition and decarbonization of our local economies consistent with the state's decarbonization goals. Recognized as a key technology in reducing emissions around the world, carbon capture and storage (CCS) is one of the best solutions to help mitigate climate change by offering both immediate decarbonization benefits and a long-term solution to reach and maintain carbon neutrality.

### Proposed 2024-25 State Budget

The Governor's proposed budget for 2024-25 should be considered a "win" for community colleges. While there isn't a lot of new money coming into the system, as of yet we aren't having significant reductions like some other agencies. The State is billions of dollar behind in revenues for last year, this year and for the forecasted next couple of years. This may present some funding growth challenges for the next several years, but thanks to the District's reserves, we are well positioned to manage the State decrease in funding and its associated impacts on our students and College/District operations.
